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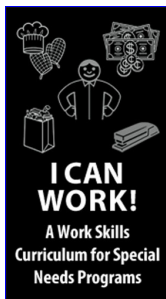

Author Angie Mahoney's [I Can Work: A Work Skills Curriculum for Special Needs Programs](#) offers the complete range of work experience, social as well as vocational, by creating the workplace within the school.

Presented as a Manual and CD, [I Can Work](#) is a five-module course designed to integrate communication skills with hands-on Pre-vocational training areas of Job Readiness, Clerical, Retail, Food Service, and the Grocery industry. To address the diverse range of student needs and learning styles, each module includes a text only version and a picture supported version for each lesson, and visual supports throughout the entire program. Additionally, each activity plan has a visual support for acceptable vs unacceptable work, a visual supported word wall, and a bank of modifications and suggestions.

Each lesson plan within each module includes IEP Objectives. Each Module is designed to take 5 to 7 weeks to complete, based on the recommended frequency of 2 forty-five minute sessions per week with the focus on one lesson plan per week.

I Can Work serves to introduce and educate middle school and high school students with special needs who are interested in working in their community. Additionally, the Program can support high school graduates ages 21 to 25 who are transitioning from school to the workplace.

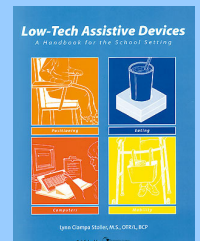
