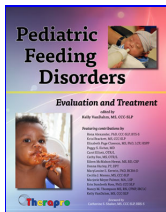

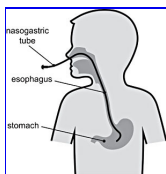

A solid plastic handle with a small nylon mesh bag, firmly attached to a screw-on ring. Put fresh food in the feeder bag and let the child explore and chew safely.



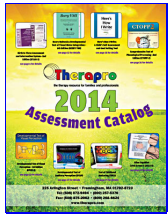
