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

● "Get Ready...Do...Done"



[Sarah Ward, M.S., CCC/SLP](#), co-director of [Cognitive Connections in Concord, MA](#), is a renowned national and international speaker on the topic of Executive Functioning. Last December, we were excited to have Sarah give a presentation on the subject to a packed house. Since then, attendees have been clamoring for more. We listened! Sarah accepted our invitation for a follow-up at Therapro. On December 5, our Saturday Seminar Series brought Sarah back for [Fostering Executive Function Skills, Part II](#). Sarah had volumes to share with us about helping all individuals from preschool age through adulthood get organized.

Sarah's a magnetic dynamo whose whirlwind talk included many innovative treatment strategies that attendees learned and could apply immediately in their work and at home. Sarah taught us how to help children plan backward in order to execute forward by first discussing what the completed task will look like, thus her three phases of executing a task: 1. *Get ready*, 2. *Do*, 3. *Done*. 



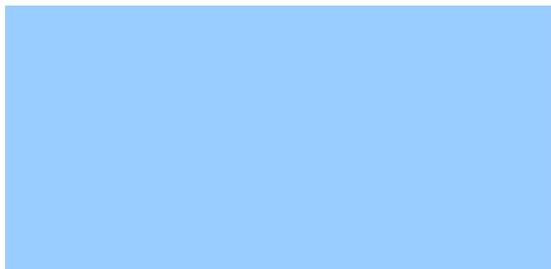
